Interview of Mrs. Babita Agarwal, Chief Guest on Exhibition Day

Anisha Negi:- Ma'am how was your experience today?

Mrs. Babita Agarwal:-It was excellent, seeing these kids reminded me of my childhood.

Anisha Negi:- Which stall did you like the most?

Mrs. Babita Agarwal:-All the were good but the best were the stalls having working models. The 'कवि सम्मेलन' was very impressive. I liked the poem recited by student Avni Sharma and what further impressed me was that the poem was her own composition.



Anisha Negi:- What difference did you find between the exhibition which was held earlier and this one?

Mrs. Babita Agarwal :-The biggest difference between the two was that this exhibition had working models and no charts were used.

Interview of Mrs. Indrani Lahiri, Guest of Honour

Deepshikha:- Kindly tell us about your experience of exhibition?

Mrs. Indrani Lahiri:-I enjoyed the exhibition very much and the different types of things you people are doing. My first pleasant surprise was when I saw your student speaking about Ukraine and how it has effected the economy of the world. I was amazed to see that there were no charts anywhere and the students were explaining everything in every stall for every subject. There were working models which were very good and can come into good use as teaching aids in classrooms.



Deepshikha:- What did you like most about the exhibition?

Mrs. Indrani Lahiri:- I like the GCEI stall very much. It exemplified what your

school is doing with GCEI, where Global Cultural Educational Initiative and International group of schools from three continents are working on environment sustainability and sustainability issues. What impressed me was that one of the students had made a stool using plastic bottles, some other had made bags which could be used in the market as most of us use "SINGLE USE PLASTIC" which is not environmental friendly. Your Art and Craft and Subject exhibitions were brilliant. The girl enacting as President Droupadi Murmu in the DIPS Buzz stall was also beautiful. To be honest it is very difficult to choose the favourite as all presentations were very impressive.

Deepshikha:- You have attended many exhibitions what difference did you find in D.I.P.S?

Mrs. Indrani Lahiri:-One most important difference what I found was that the students didn't use chart paper. whether it was to show the circulation of blood, how water gets into a pump or how filtration takes place. All were from through the working models that was brilliant.

Deepshikha:- Do you think these type of exhibition helpful in holistic development of students. How?

Mrs. Indrani Lahiri:-Certainly, hundred percent. As when learning from a text book happens, most of the information remain in the text book. But projects and working models. are helpful for actual learning. Doing things ourselves goes beyond the text book. It was fantastic about the exhibition.


Deepshikha:- Would you like to give any suggestions to our students?


