Droupadi Murmu (20th June, 1958)

Ms. Droupadi Murmu is the 15th President of India and she is the second woman President after Ms. Pratibha Patil. She is the first President of the country born in Independent India.

Ms. Droupadi Murmu was born in a Santhal family in Mayurbhanj, Odisha. Santhals are one of the largest tribes mostly settled in West Bengal, Odisha and Jharkhand. She belongs to one of the most backward district of India, President Murmu grew up in a village where a young girl being able to obtain the primary education was a dream. She however beat the odds and became the first person in her village to enroll for college education. She holds a graduation degree from the state's prestigious Rama Devi Women's College. It is the first women's university in Odisha. She was the first woman Governor of Jharkhand.

Anita Mausi- I would like to say Thank you ! to all the members of DIPS for creating a familiar environment in the school.

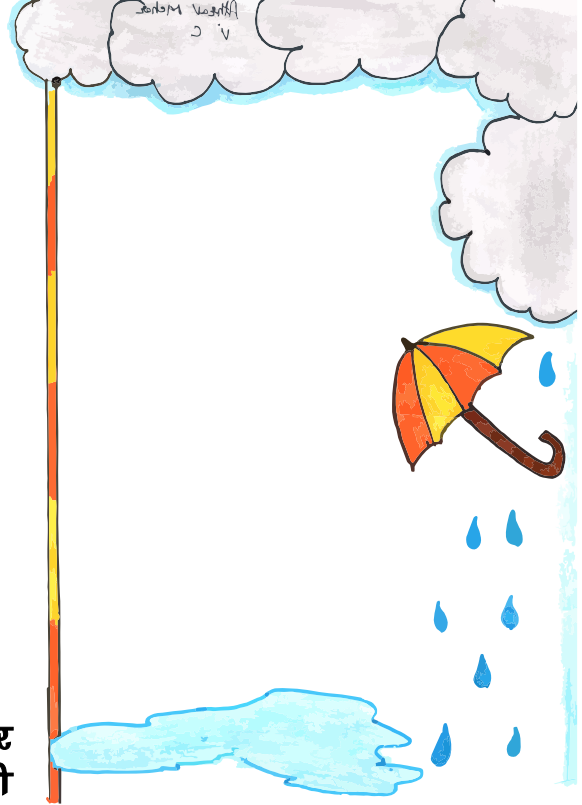

Monsoon winds



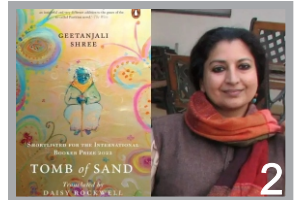

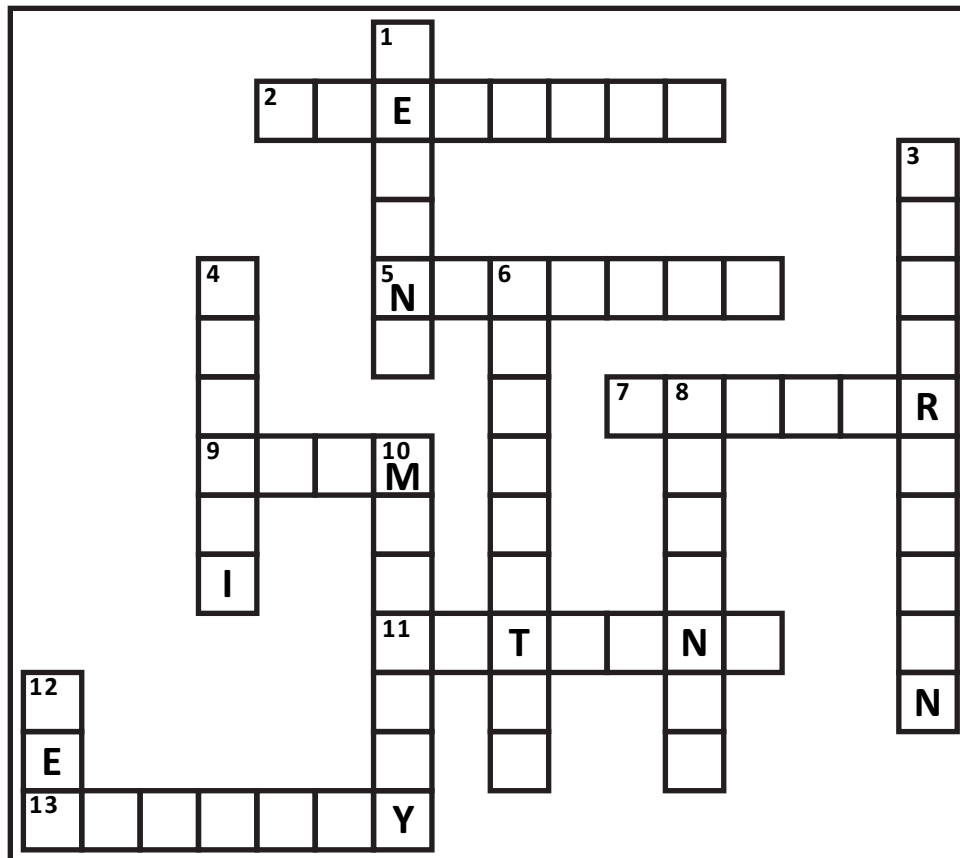

COMBINED DEFENCE SERVICES (CDS)

The Combined Defence Services Examination is conducted by Union Public Service Commission for recruitment of commissioned officers in the Indian Military Academy (IMA), Officers Training Academy (OTA), Indian Naval Academy (INA) and Indian Air force Academy (AFA). The examination is conducted twice a year in April and September respectively. Qualified candidates are admitted into the respective academies after an interview conducted by Services Selection Board (SSB).



AGE LIMIT FOR

Indian Military Academy – 19 to 24 years

Air Force Academy – 19 to 24 years

Naval Academy – 19 to 24 years

Officers Training Academy – 19 to 25 years

For I.M.A and Officers Training Academy – Degree from a recognized university or equivalent

For I.N.A – Degree in Engineering from a recognized University or equivalent

For A.F.A – Degree of a recognized university (with Physics & mathematics 10+2 level) or Bachelor of Engineering.

-: PHYSICAL STANDARDS :-

The basic physical standards for a candidate are:-

1. The minimum acceptable height for male candidates is 157.5 cms. (157 cms for Navy and 162.5 cms for Air Force). For Women candidates minimum acceptable height is 152 cms. For Gorkhas and individuals belonging to hills of North-Eastern region of India, Garhwali and Kumaon, the Minimum acceptable height will be 5 cms less.
2. Candidates should be mentally as well as physically fit.
3. Permanent tattoos are prohibited on any part of body.
4. No hernia anywhere on the body.
5. No hearing impairment, deformities/disabilities in ears vestibule-cochlear system.
6. There is no active congenital venereal disease.

FIVE TEMPLE OF PANCHKEDAR

Panch Kedar refers to five temples collectively dedicated to "Lord Shiva". These temples are located in the Garhwal region, Uttarakhand. There are several stories behind the formation of these temples. According to Mahabharata, when Pandavas were searching for 'Lord Shiva', he turned into a bull and disappeared. Later he reappeared in body parts at different places. Pandavas built temples at these places. These temples are :-

Kedarnath:-



It is the place where Shiva's hump was appeared. It is situated at the height of 3583 m and located at Rudraprayag district of Uttarakhand. It is open for public from April to November.

Tungnath:-

It is the place where Shiva's arms appeared. It is the highest of Panch Kedar temples, lies at the height of 3690 m. It is located in Rudraprayag district of Uttarakhand.



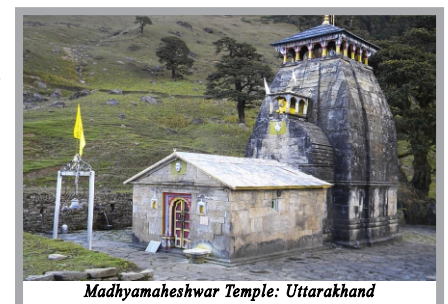
Rudranath:-

It is the place where Shiva's face appeared. It is situated at the height of 3600 m. Many sacred kunds such as Surya Kund, Chandra Kund, Tara Kund and Mana Kund exists around the temple. Beautiful peaks of Nanda Devi makes this place amazing.



Madhya Maheshwar:-

It is the place where Shiva's naval part emerged. It is situated at the height of 3497 m. The temple lies in Gaundar village of Garhwal Himalaya. The beautiful forest, wildlife, waterfalls and surrounding peaks makes this place fabulous.



Kalpeshwar:-

It is the place where Shiva's hair appeared. We all know that Shiva is also known as 'Jatadhari' or 'Jateshwar' for his long and tangled locks. It is situated at the height of 2200 m and located at Ugram valley in Garhwal region of Uttarakhand.
